Has also mediated cases involving whether a motion picture distributor had fulfilled its contractual distribution obligations and damage issues relating to dispute. Also experienced with issues involving spousal support, custody and family related issues.

Mediator Style & Process Preferences

I view mediation as a process in which the mediator acts to facilitate a negotiated settlement of the disputes between parties. I have a background in law and clinical psychology and note the importance of affording the parties a full and fair opportunity to express their perspectives.

Sometimes the presented issue, is only one part of the dispute and underlying considerations present themselves. I view as critical the mediator's ability to patiently hear the issues both presented by the parties and those that exist below the line.
